





## Community Services report

### **Troy Cassar Daley Concert**

Last Friday night, the club assisted with the staging of a concert in the School of Arts, starring well known country and western artist Troy Cassar Daley. Troy is currently touring smaller country venues performing as a solo artist and with his 17 year old daughter Jemma as his support act. It is providing him with an opportunity to give Jemma some exposure as an up and coming artist.

The club was approached by Troy's management with a request to assist with the physical set up of the venue and the provision of a bar and food for those attending. Bill Seelis took the running with the logistics and Lee Saunders provided the set up for the bar and food.

The set up of the seating in the venue was done on the Thursday with Bill, Phil Monaghan, Ian Nicol and self setting out the 240 chairs required for the performance on Friday night. Bill, Ken Hutt, Guy Mainsbridge and myself then worked as ushers and dog's bodies for the concert and afterwards returned all of the chairs to the side hall.

Lee and her crew of IGA personnel provided the service for the food and drinks required by the patrons with alcoholic and non alcoholic drinks, pies, sausage rolls, hamburgers, and buckets of chips.

The night went off without a hitch and provided an opportunity for the club to provide support for the event. Whilst a bottom line has not yet been finalised, the donation to the club will be in excess of \$500 – not a bad night's little earner for a small contribution.

Our sincere thanks go to Lee for the provision and service of food and drinks at Cost, to Bill Seelis for his organisation of the logistics and to those members mentioned above who assisted with the set up and conduct of the event.




