The primary goal of the RAMHP is to work with communities and agencies in rural and remote NSW to identify individuals and communities who are experiencing, or at risk of developing, signs and symptoms of mental ill-health, and to link them to services and resources appropriate to their circumstances.

Berry Branch of the CWA of NSW has organised a Community Support Skills Training session for organisations. The two hour training session will include

topics such as -

What is stress - What is mental health - The mental health continuum - How will I know if someone is unwell - How can I have the conversation - Where can I find help - Mental health professionals - Mental health services - What if someone is at risk of suicide - When helping others - How can I look after myself?

The training session will be at the CWA rooms, 79 Victoria Street, Berry commencing at 10.30 a.m. Thursday 14th November, 2019.




